WHAT DOES NATIONWIDE DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal and state laws give consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal and state laws also require us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Social Security number and income ▪ Account balances, transaction history, and credit history ▪ Assets and insurance claim history
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Nationwide chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Who is providing this notice?

Nationwide Securities, LLC (“Nationwide”).

What we do

How does Nationwide protect my personal information?

To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal and state laws. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. We limit access to your information to those who need it to do their job.

How does Nationwide collect my personal information?

We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- open an account, apply for insurance, or give us your contact information
- pay your insurance premiums or file an insurance claim
- show your driver’s license or conduct business with us

We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.

Why can’t I limit all sharing?

Federal and state laws give you the right to limit only

- sharing for affiliates’ everyday business purposes—information about your creditworthiness
- affiliates from using your information to market to you
- sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. See below for more on your rights under state law.

What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone

Your choices will apply to everyone on your account.

Definitions

Affiliates

Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. Our affiliates include companies with the Nationwide name such as Nationwide Financial Services, Inc., Nationwide Life Insurance Company, Nationwide Bank, and Nationwide Mutual Insurance Company. Nonaffiliates

Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. Nationwide does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.

Joint marketing

A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. Our joint marketing partners include financial service companies.

For Vermont Customers: We will not disclose information about your creditworthiness to our affiliates and will not disclose your personal information, financial information, credit report, or health information to nonaffiliated third parties to market to you, other than as permitted by Vermont law, unless you authorize us to make those disclosures.

For insurance customers in AZ, CT, GA, IL, ME, MA, MT, NV, NJ, NM, NC, ND, OH, OR, and VA only: The term “Information” means information we collect during an insurance transaction. We will not use your medical information for marketing purposes without your consent. We may share your Information with others, including insurance-support organizations, insurance regulatory authorities, law enforcement, and consumer reporting agencies, without your prior authorization as permitted or required by law. Information obtained from a report prepared by an insurance-support organization may be retained by the insurance-support organization and disclosed to other persons.

Accessing your information: You have a right to access and correct your personal information. To request a copy of your personal information, write to: **Nationwide, One Nationwide Plaza, 1-25-101, Columbus, OH, 43215**, and have your signature notarized. This is for your protection so we may prove your identity. Please include your name, address, and your policy, contract, or account number. You can change your personal information at Nationwide.com or by calling your agent. We can’t change information that other companies, like credit agencies, provide to us. You’ll need to ask them to change it.
